

Program Schedule August 5 – August 10 Roan Mountain State Park



Monday, Aug 5

5:00 PM

Tree ID Walk-Learn to identify some common trees as we take an easy walk out of the campground. Come discover just how diverse and important our trees are in the Southern Appalachian forests, and maybe learn a bit about the trees in your own backyard! Meet Meg at Campground Check-In.

Wednesday, Aug 7

9:00 AM

Peg Leg Mine Hike- This trail leads back from the old grist mill over an iron ore vein to a mine. Come learn about the history of the mine and the importance of this vein to the development of Roan Mountain. Meet Brian at the Visitors' Center.

10:00 AM

Hike the Balds- Come out for a hike of unparalleled views and learn about the rare ecosystems that make Roan Mountain such a unique place, all while hiking along the Appalachian Trail! Please bring sturdy shoes, water, jacket, and pack a lunch. We will be hiking 5 miles round trip along the Roan Highlands to Grassy Ridge and back. Trail can be moderately difficult and steep in sections. Meet Amanda at Park Headquarters and we'll carpool to Carver's Gap.

Thursday, Aug 8

Volunteer Day-Calling all hands! Join park rangers for a rewarding day of work where we help maintain and fix sections of some of your favorite trails. No experience necessary. Please wear comfortable clothes for hiking, closed-toe shoes, pack a lunch, bring water and work gloves if possible. We look forward to working beside you! Meet at Park Headquarters.

Blue 2 Hike- Learn some of our park's cultural and natural history while hiking this beautiful and peaceful trail. Meet Brian at the Blue 2 trailhead (Shelter 2 Entrance).

Creek Walk- Come cool off in the Doe River as we learn about stream ecology and discover some aquatic life forms in their natural habitat. You may be surprised at what we find! Wear closed toed shoes and be prepared to get in the water. Meet Brian at Campground Check-In.
