Park guests are invited to observe the landing from a SAFE DISTANCE behind the softball backstop and Cabin Area. The landing is scheduled to take place at approximately 10:00 AM. Cars will not be permitted to drive into the area after the Landing Zone is established, so please plan to arrive no later than 9:45 AM.
